Sealing and insulating the “envelope” or “shell” of your home – its outer walls, ceiling, windows, doors, and floors – is often the most effective way to improve energy efficiency and comfort.\* At their website, [www.energystar.gov](http://www.energystar.gov), ENERGY STAR offers guidance and instructions for accomplishing this. As it relates to caulks, sealants, and/or insulating foam, ENERGY STAR has not qualified specific products or brands for this rating.

Further, the 2009 International Energy Conservation Code® Section 402.4.1 Building Thermal Envelop lists specific caulking applications, but it does not offer information as to whether caulks, sealants, and/or insulating foams qualify to receive the Federal Tax Credit for Energy Efficiency via the Internal Revenue Service.
